One by One

The children's and youth services have been going well. We're continually asking ourselves what we can do to make the services better.

At the beginning of the year the youth services were very hard for us. We weren't sure if the youth really wanted to be there or not because often times they'd talk during the service or get up and walk around. We've made some small changes and seen a huge difference!

One week the bus that goes to pick up the youth kids was a little later than normal so about half of the kids walked to the church. It's about a 45 minute walk!

We're able to see that the kids are enjoying the services, inviting their friends, and paying better attention now.

In addition to the youth services going well, the children's services continue to go well. At times, though, it can get difficult with 150-200 kids!

The main challenge we have with the kids is the exit. The first service we had, one year ago in May, the exit was a complete disaster and ever since we have been trying to improve it. We finally feel that we have found the solution, but it has only been through a lot of trial and error. There is still room for more improvement!

In June we have two shortterm missions teams coming to work with us. One is from Wildwood Church in Norman, OK and the other is from Woodcreek Church in Dallas, TX. The two teams are coming one day apart and will be very busy with both ministry events and physical work.

One team will be painting the offices at the church and converting some of the classrooms at the church into housing for children when we start The Refuge Project. The other team will be working at House of Hope and doing ministry events with us.

A week after the second team leaves, most of the staff will be traveling to the USA to continue their fundraising. There are more details about my trip on the next page.

While we are in the states we will not have children's services, however, we are going to continue with the youth. Please pray that the services go well these three weeks and for those who remain in Nicaragua to conduct them.

Oops, Did I Say That??

My Spanish continues to improve, and I haven't made any really funny/bad mistakes recently. I've been told that at times I have a Mexican accent. I'm not sure how that happened since I'm around Nicaraguans all the time and not Mexicans! I have, however, noticed that sometimes when I'm

speaking English I have a Latin accent.

I'm to the point now where it's hard to speak English after having spoken Spanish during the day.

I find myself constructing sentences in English the way they would be done in Spanish. There are also times when someone will ask how to say something in English and I honestly can't remember.

Although this can be frustrating at times, I think (and hope) that it means I'm doing well with my new language, and that I'm adjusting well to speaking it!
